


SERVING GEORGIA'S 8TH DISTRICT

1) Ocmulgee Mounds National Historic Park

A prehistoric site that was home to American Indian cultures for thousands of years. Snap a photo of your visit and a cultural fact you found interesting.

2) Museum of Aviation

The second-largest aerospace museum of the United States Air Force, this museum includes four exhibit buildings and more than 85 historic aircraft. Which aircraft was the most interesting to you, and what was it used for?

3) Georgia's Old Governor's Mansion

Georgia's Old Governor's Mansion is a National Historic Landmark. It was home to eight Georgia governors and their families from 1839-1868. What part of the Old Governor's Mansion stood out to you the most?

4) Go Fish Education Center

The Go Fish Education Center is operated by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources' Wildlife Resources Division. What is one responsible fishing or boating practice that helps protect Georgia's waterways?

5) Georgia Veterans State Park

This state park was established in 1946 as a memorial to U.S. Veterans. The park holds aircraft, military vehicles, weapons, uniforms and other artifacts spanning from the Revolutionary war to present. Name one veteran recognized and why they are recognized.

6) Georgia's National Fairgrounds & Agricenter

An event complex that is open year-round, it hosts meetings, concerts, livestock shows, rodeos, and more. Share a photo from your visit and include a brief description highlighting the positive impact the Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter has on Georgia.

7) Griswoldville Historic Battlefield

A Civil War site recognizing the November 22, 1864, battle during General Sherman's March. Provide a short summary of what is written on one of the historical markers.

8) Tubman African American Museum

The largest of its kind in the southeast, dedicated to educating people about the Art, History and Culture of African Americans. Share a photo of yourself with an exhibit that stood out to you the most.

9) Monroe County Historical Society

This museum collects and preserves artifacts relevant to Monroe County's heritage. Write about Monroe County's role in Georgia history.

10) Jarrell Plantation State Historic Site

Dating back to 1847, through generations of family members, Jarrell Plantation Historic Site is one of the last remaining examples of a vanishing culture. In what ways does Jarrell Plantation reflect middle Georgia's shift from a farm-based economy to an industrial one?

11) Bond Swamp National Wildlife Refuge

This Wildlife Refuge, established in 1989, protects and maintains the forested wetland ecosystem of the Ocmulgee River floodplain. Why are wetlands important to Georgia's environment?

12) Titan I Missile

This 96-foot tall missile from the 1960's was one of the United States' first multi-stage ICBMs and was donated to the Cordele Rotary Club by the Federal government. Share a photo with the missile.

13) GA Grown HWY 37 & 41 Trails

These trails are a great way to experience the 8th Congressional District's rich heritage of agriculture. Take a picture visiting one or more of the trail stops.

14) GA Museum of Agriculture

An immersive experience into the agrarian and cultural traditions of the 19th century American South. See the innovative and storied history of the Wiregrass region of Southern Georgia through hands-on learning experiences and a sweeping landscape of historic sites and artifacts. Visit the museum and share what impacted you the most about your tour.

15) 8th Congressional District Colleges & Universities

For 250 years, education has helped shaped the future of America. Share a photo at one of the many higher education opportunities in our district.

16) County Courthouse

Share a photo of a visit to your local courthouse and tell us a law you would create or change for the benefit of Georgians

17) Local Government

18) Vidalia Onions

Visit a local farmers market from April to August to find this specialty crop that's unique to just 20 counties in Georgia.

19) Moody Air Force Base

Moody Air Force Base is one of nine major military installations in the state of Georgia. Describe what having MAFB in Georgia means to you

20) The Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge (Clinch County)

Visit this 438,000-acre wet land considered to be one of the seven Natural Wonders of Georgia & share a picture.

21) Local Festivals

From fire ants to honeybees to watermelon and cherry blossoms – our local towns are known for their annual celebrations of heritage and community. Visit a festival and explain why it's so important to the history of our state and the citizens.

22) World War II Flight Training Museum (Douglas, GA)

The 63rd Army Air Forces Flying Training Detachment (Primary) was originally a part of South Georgia College's pilot training program. From 1941-1944, between 5,000 and 10,000 cadets were enrolled. Here the cadets mastered basic flying maneuvers and learned to fly. The museum has exhibits of the 63rd's training, aircraft, and equipment. Share a picture with your favorite exhibit.

23) Visit a Monument or Memorial in your community

24) Georgia Peanut Commission
